Our nurses, pharmacists and doctors are always here ready to help you quickly and for free. Calling your poison center may save you a trip to the doctor or hospital.



In case of a power outage, use a flashlight to check medicine labels, cleaners and other products before use.



Keep antifreeze, snow salt or ice melt, and other chemicals in their original containers and away from children and animals.



Install carbon monoxide alarms on every floor of your home. Carbon monoxide is found in fumes when you burn fuel in cars, generators, stoves, furnaces and more.



When the power is out, keep the refrigerator and freezer doors closed to maintain cold temperature. Throw out perishable food if the power has been out for 4 hours or more.



Almost anything can be poisonous if it's used in the wrong way, in the wrong amount, or by the wrong person.
